Thank You to the PTA

This has been an amazing year for the PTA. Their fundraising efforts have done so much to keep important aspects of the school going in a difficult time for school budgets. Already this year they have supported us by funding the new chromebooks that children across the school are enjoying using and enabled us to keep our specialist music teaching provided by Mr Evans that the children love so much. Only this week the PTA have donated over £10,000 to enable us to buy the new "Monster Phonics" scheme that we will be introducing to the school next term. Back to School in September

The first day back to school for children in years 1 to 6 will be Monday 4th September (children in nursery and reception will have their own starting days). On Monday 11th September we will be holding an "Open Classrooms" event for classes in years 1 to 6 from 8:30am to 9:00am. This is when children can bring their parents into their classroom to show them their "place of work". Parents and carers can also meet the class teacher (though it is not the time to talk about any particular issue in detail, more a chance to say a brief hello).

Parents and children can arrive from 8:30am (you don't have to arrive early, school will still "officially" start at the normal time of 8:45am, but we will open the gates early at 8:30am to support those who might be rushing off to work).

We will send more details in September, but thought parents and carers might like to get the date in their diaries.

School Dinners

From next September we are having to increase the cost of a school dinner to £2.25. We have worked with our caterers Lunchtime to absorb rising costs over the last year, but we do now have to put the price up to reflect some of those costs. The school lunch still represents good value for money and is certainly one of the cheapest, if not the cheapest, school dinner in Cambridge so still represents excellent value for money.

School lunches for the full half term from September will therefore be £78.75, (£11.25 per week).

Can you help us improve city walking routes?

Cambridge Living Streets is launching a project to map widely used walking routes around the city and identify key improvements to make these journeys safer and more pleasant. Having safe walking routes to schools is a key part of this. We'll record key routes and proposed improvements on a dedicated website, so people can then click on a journey to find a good route to use. They can also send in comments and suggest additions.
