

Percentage of pupils responding 'yes' to: Does your school...








Playtimes


During school playtimes (including dinner times), do you spend time...

Actions / changes taken since survey

- Healthy Eating: Sarah Donaldson has introduced the concept of Go, Grow and Glow foods in KS 1 and 2 assemblies. Healthy eating also in PSHE curriculum. Food Policy has been drafted out. New lunch provider has focus on healthy eating: lots of fruit available.
- Physical Activity: Lots and lots of clubs now being run throughout school. Active travel: Cycling proficiency course: year 6 children have completed course. Helmets are compulsory. We are considering reviewing our policy on cycling to school and the use of helmets.
 KS1 and KS 2 Assemblies on the importance or wearing helmets to school have been /will be delivered.
- Illegal Drugs: continued high quality teaching.
- Worrying: Discussion with Year 5 teachers. Good relationship has been built up. Buddy benches

- Self Esteem: Children with particular needs have been seeing Julie for one to one work.
- Silver SEAL groups are run when/if necessary.
- Internet Safety: Since the survey, we have had a whole school 'Safer Internet Day'.
- Bullying: Anti bullying week took place after the survey. Planned by the teachers, whole school partner activity plus assemblies from Coleridge school and other classroom based work. Child friendly anti bullying policy: case study has been well received and praised by the PSHE service and is now used as an exemplar on training courses in Cambs.
- Playtimes: School Council requested Buddy Benches in both Reception and Main playgrounds. School Council reps are doubling up as buddies at lunchtimes. Young Sports Leaders trained and working. PTA has funded playground equipment. Lunchtime supervisors have all been trained. Guided activities now run every lunchtime eg: skipping etc.

 Views and opinions: School Council have been focusing on celebrating their recent achievements. Change in teachers will hopefully have changed how they are feeling this year.
